

Eight years ago, I left the classroom to launch a nonprofit dedicated to supporting New Orleans educators. Today, we serve over 1,200 teachers annually through programs like the Equipment Lending Co-op, Teacher Free-Store, and Service Learning Program, all helping provide hands-on education to local students in under-resourced schools.


In 2021, we arrived in our forever home - the STEM Ecosystem Hub - a 10,000 sq. ft. facility where we run programs and collaborate with over 200 regional nonprofits. But, our building urgently needs upgrades to meet increasing demand. The Teacher Free-Store lacks climate control, making it uncomfortable for teachers and inefficient for supplies. And to truly support Greater New Orleans classrooms, we must expand workspaces to accommodate our growing team, and add publicly accessible training space for convening local nonprofits and educators.

To address these needs, we've launched a \$450,000 Capital Renovation Campaign, with the goal of completing fundraising by the end of 2025. Funds will create a modern Innovators' Lab for teacher training, improve the Teacher Free-Store, and upgrade our staff facilities including communal spaces such as the Teachers' Lounge, allowing us to double our impact and reach more educators.

STEM Library Lab is gearing up to begin a comprehensive 3 phase round of renovations to our STEM Ecosystem Hub building, and make our spaces shine!




INNOVATORS' LAB

Upstairs, the current office spaces will be restructured to create the **Innovators' Lab**, a flexible space open to nonprofits to use for workshops, training sessions, retreats, and more. This will ensure that downstairs, the Teachers' Lounge remains a dynamic convening and coworking space for educators to collaborate and network.

TEACHER FREE-STORE

A major overhaul to the **Teacher Free-Store**, our most utilized program, will create a dedicated **garage and donation intake station** for our SLL on Wheels program, as well as allow natural light and climate control systems to create a comfortable environment for teachers to engage.





WORKSPACE - FLOOR 2

Two **open coworking bullpens** offer flexibility as well as a collaborative and communal work environment. **Four new offices** and a **small conference room** will accompany new **storage spaces** to accommodate the Library's growing collections. These modernizations will ensure our growing team is able to meet the needs of teachers and schools across Greater New Orleans.
